NON-PREFERENTIAL TREATMENT FOR TRUSTEES POLICY

Attention Deficit Disorders Uniting Parents (ADDUP) was set up to bring families together, to guide parents in the right direction to find the practical help they need for their children and to promote both public and professional awareness of ADHD. We value the input that we have from our staff and volunteers in delivering the high standard of service to our users

The purpose of this policy is to make it clear and publicly known that all Trustees of Addup give their time voluntarily and **do not** receive payment* for doing so. Trustees also **do not** receive any kind of gifts or preferential treatment when dealing with Addup, for example access to services or when making bookings for outings or events.

Trustees and their families are treated, in all respects, in the same way as any other member would be. For example, they are expected to pay for outings/events and are not given any priority when making any bookings or accessing any of the services of Addup.

Trustees do not receive payment*, gifts or any form of preferential treatment as a result of being on the Addup Committee.

It is recommended that periodically the above be re-iterated in the Minutes at Committee Meetings, as a reminder to all concerned that this is the case.

The Addup Management Committee will be responsible for overseeing the effectiveness of this policy, which will be reviewed annually.
