Our work has seen those children who started with us become adults who are now living successful and prosperous lives, doing work that is giving back to society and, we feel we played a part by being there for them, supporting, guiding and teaching them how to accept their ADHD and to use it as an asset to learning and achieving.

Do we have another 25 years in us? Does ADHD still affect children? Do families still need support? I would say yes so, at least another 25 years it seems!

# Clubs and Activities

Due to a successful small funding application we have made some changes to clubs currently running which started after the October half term and are as follows:

## <u> Monday - currently Life Skills</u>

From January this will become a Health & Fitness programme which will include:

A health & fitness and wellbeing programme to channel the children's energies into a positive programme of sport and fitness to help burn their excess energy while achieving goals leading to improved confidence and

self-esteem. We plan to introduce them to healthy food choices while thinking about what they eat and how it affects the planet. Wellbeing will include lifestyle choices, peer relationships, issues around road safety, and recycling, again thinking about the planet. Some of this work is

already included in the project and Life Skills will continue to be delivered alongside this project.



# Wednesday - Children's Voice's

Following the parents forum meeting and subsequence evaluation form "Shaping Addup" a suggestion was made for a homework club. Addup has, in the past, run a homework club however, the numbers dwindled so it ceased. We are now going to run a homework section on Wednesdays for the first half an hour of the session. This will be on a voluntary basis for the children, who are booked in for Children's Voices, to either participate or

not. This will be incorporated into the activity till the end of year, the staff will monitor and report back to see if there is a need to run a specific group for homework and if so we will seek funding.

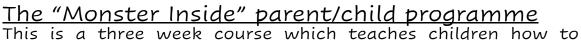
The other hour of Children's Voices will continue as it is now with life skills, fun and games.

## Saturday Drama

The drama group continues as the children are working towards their production in December. The shows take place on Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> December at 6pm and Sunday 4<sup>th</sup> December at 2pm.

Tickets cost £5 per adult & £3 per child.

There are places available for the Drama group in the new year, when the children will start work on a new production, we do not expect the children to be professionals, the programme is run to boost the children's confidence and self-esteem while having fun.



This is a three week course which teaches children how to manage their ADHD and for the parent/carers we put you inside your child's head to help you understand how their ADHD impacts on them. Then we teach you how to do it differently to

reduce the risk of "meltdowns"



### Parent Support Network Meetings

These operate the first Wednesday of most months. This is for parent/carers only and gives you an opportunity to meet other parents, raise issues and concerns and seek support. We intend to invite guest speakers, so please let us know who you would like to visit. The staff attended the last meeting and we are planning to bring back some

of the first children of Addup, now adults, to tell you how they survived ADHD. They were very popular the last time they visited. These meetings will now be held at the Addup Centre (home)
